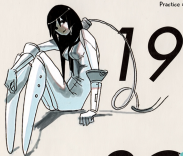

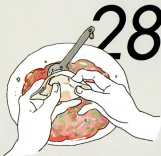

I drew this one so that I could reflect back on the deliciousness.



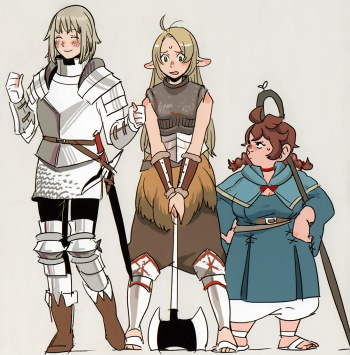
